BEAM ME UP

Technological advances are making lasers more inclusive. By Erin Reimel

Thankfully, today's lasers are more customizable and less dependent on using contrast alone, making them more inclusive. "In the last several years, we've had lasers that are safe for dark skin, but the limit has been efficacy," says New York dermatologist Paul Jarrod Frank, MD. He lauds the new Motus AX hair removal laser as the most effective device for a wide range of skin tones—and it's virtually painless. The difference is the blue glass tip at the end of the laser's wand. It's cool to the touch and delivers energy by slowly heating up the skin rather than blasting it all at once.
